

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



EXPERIENCING ANTARCTICA Antarctica is the ultimate travel experience whether you're a citizen explorer or a professional adventurer. Found at the bottom of the world, Antarctica is a remote wilderness, untrammeled and untamed. It requires experience to assume responsibility for people's safety, but your expedition team and Nansen Explorer have been safely sharing the wonders of the White Continent for decades. What draws people here is what they've learned about Antarctica-the superlatives, from the history of the Golden Age explorers—to the threats the continent faces from climate change. And most importantly, what they've seen-the impossibly beautiful images. A vast continent of ice and the awe-inspiring power of raw nature, Antarctica is the world's most pristine environment, offering unparalleled landscapes, natural beauty, an abundance of wildlife and exhilarating adventures. Every



voyage to Antarctica is unique, with the route decided by the weather and ice conditions as you explore this last truly wild continent. A flexible itinerary allows the yacht to follow the best conditions, using near-constant daylight to discover an amazing coastline of mountains, fjords and islands.



This is a yacht expedition, designed for flexibility and spontaneity. The actual day-by-day itinerary will be determined by your Captain and Expedition Guide according to weather conditions, and each day they will discuss options for activities and landing sites with the group. You will spend your days exploring the Antarctica Peninsula, taking time to recount the highlights through shared stories and photographs.

DAYS 1-2:

Arrive in Puerto Williams and transfer to the port to board Nansen Explorer. You will meet your Expedition Team and shipmates. Settle into your home for the next 11 nights, transiting southward through the picturesque Beagle Channel enroute to the famed Drake Passage. This infamous body of water stretches between the southern tip of South America and the northern end of the Antarctic Peninsula. This is the realm of the albatross, majestic wanderers of the Southern Ocean, who will accompany you on the approximately 590- nautical-mile journey over the next two days. Crossing the Antarctic Convergence, there is a noticeable change as currents and upwellings provide plentiful food for the birds and whales that thrive in these waters – this is one of the most abundant and pristine wildlife areas on the planet.



DAYS 3-9: Depending on the route the voyage takes, some highlights to anticipate:

SOUTH SHETLAND ISLANDS

These wildlife-rich islands are on the edge of the Drake Passage at the northern extent of Antarctica. Numerous penguin colonies, seals and seabirds inhabit the islands and the South Shetlands have a deep and intriguing history from the sealing and whaling eras.

DECEPTION ISLAND

Deception Island is the flooded caldera of a volcano that last erupted in the 1970s. In addition to its fascinating geology and history of shore-based whaling, the island is home to one of the region's largest chinstrap penguin colonies.

ANTARCTIC SOUND & THE WEDDELL SEA

Known as Iceberg Alley, Antarctic Sound is at the very north-eastern point of the Antarctic Peninsula, where large tabular icebergs drift in the Weddell Sea. We may land and visit Adelie penguin colonies at Paulet Island, Brown Bluff, Devil Island, or elsewhere in the area. Exploring the fringes of the Weddell Sea on the eastern side of the Peninsula, we'll search the ice floes for emperor penguins. The largest of the penguins, the magnificent adults are hard to find during austral summer when their winter breeding colony on Snow Hill Island disperses. There is the chance, however, of finding a newlyfledged juvenile or two resting on the ice.







THE DANCO COAST & GERLACHE STRAIT

We plan to spend time in this breathtakingly scenic area on the western side of the Antarctic Peninsula, where you'll explore numerous islands andchannels, filling your camera's memory card. Visit gentoo penguin colonies and cruise with the yacht and tenders past immense glaciers among mesmerizing icebergs in Paradise Bay, Errera Channel, Neko Harbour, Port Lockroy, Lemaire Channel, Petermann Island and Booth Island. Humpback, minke and orca whales can often be found in these tranquil waters.

DAYS 10-11:

Begin the journey back to Puerto Williams. Spend time on deck watching for the whales that frequent these waters, or enjoying the acrobatic maneuvers of black-browed albatross, Wilson's storm petrels, and sooty shearwaters as they crisscross the sky. Preparing to say farewell to your shipmates, there is time to visit over a refreshing drink and download photos for sharing.

DAY 12:

Arrive Puerto Williams. Transfer to the airport and return flights home.





DAY 1:

Arrive in Greenland at the international airport at Kangerlussuaq, the main air hub in Greenland and the only airport in west Greenland suitable for jet aircraft. The airport dates from American settlement during and after World War II, when the site was known as Bluie West-8 and Sondrestrom Air Base. Transfer to your scheduled Air Greenland flight to Sisimiut, a charming community whose name means "inhabitants by the fox burrows," to meet *Nansen Explorer*, your home for the next 7 nights. The yacht will depart Sisimiut this afternoon and, conditions permitting, sail north to Disko Bay. Once underway, we prepare for the first skiing day tomorrow.

DAYS 2-7:

Nansen Explorer will spend the week exploring Disko Bay, to access mountains rising some 1000 meters straight from the sea. The scenery is spectacular—with breathtaking views of glaciers and the sea; you may even spot whales from the vessel or as you ski down. And the terrain is superb, offering wide, treeless expanses and exhilarating descents. The long days of Arctic summer and great snow conditions—this expedition is scheduled in prime season—will mean packed days of skiing along with other activities. In between runs or in lieu of skiing for those inclined, the expedition team can arrange landings, hikes, fishing, kayaking or Zodiac cruising in the peerless late-evening Arctic light, or to local communities to experience the Greenlandic way of life.

DAY 8:

Disembark *Nansen Explorer* at Ilulissat, and transfer to your scheduled Greenland Air flight to the international airport at Kangerlussuaq for flights home.

HELICOPTER & SKI INFORMATION

Ski operations will be managed by experienced heli-ski guides with a ratio of 1 guide to every 4 skiers and a minimum of 2 guides in the field at any one time. Guides carry additional safety equipment, radios and satellite communications with our floating basecamp, *Nansen Explorer*. Personal safety equipment including harnesses, beacons, probes, shovels and airbag backpacks are provided on board. There is the option to rent skis on board or you may bring your own. Ski tuning is available on board.

Our helicopter will be a Eurocopter AS350 (Airbus Helicopters H-125), the preferred model for heli-ski operations worldwide, specially equipped for overwater and wilderness operations, flown by a highly experienced Arctic mountain pilot.

There will be a maximum of 12 skiers in 3 helicopter groups, allowing for rapid lifts and movement between ski areas. Should weather conditions not permit heli-ski operations, alternative activities will be offered including ski touring, kayaking, whale watching, hiking, or landings to visit towns or villages.
