We are excited to offer an extraordinary opportunity to visit Antarctica aboard the <u>Hans Hansson</u>, operated by long-time friends of ours who specialize in small-vessel Antarctic adventures. In an era when Antarctic expedition vessels are getting larger and larger, Hans Hansson offers a wonderful way to travel with a small-group expedition, on a comfortable and highly capable vessel that serves as an excellent platform for photography and can get into locations that bigger ships can't reach.

Frans Lanting and Chris Eckstrom are long-time Antarctica veterans, having produced a vast body of photographic and video work here on assignment for National Geographic and other publications. Their knowledge of Antarctic ecology and the history of Antarctic exploration will impress even the savviest Antarctic traveler. Justin Black, Visionary Wild's founder, is an IAATO-certified Antarctic guide, who cherishes the opportunity to share the Antarctic experience with passionate photographers each year. Our creative focus on this trip will be evenly divided between the wildlife spectacle and sublime landscape. Our route will take us to colonies of Adélie, Chinstrap, and Gentoo penguins (plus the possibility of sighting the odd Emperor or Macaroni), and along the way we will encounter Leopard, Crab-Eater, and Weddell Seals, Orcas and Humpback Whales, and an array of Antarctic birdlife. The dramatic landscape of glacier-covered mountains and islands rises from the various sheltered channels, dotted with immense icebergs. The light at this time of year is perfect for photography. When the weather is clear, golden light endures around sunrise and sunset, and dusk and dawn colors merge into one over the few hours when the sun dips below the horizon. The diffuse light of overcast conditions will be perfect for wildlife portraits.

We will spend almost two weeks on location at Antarctica, rather than wasting precious days "rockin' and rollin" on the Drake Passage crossing. As masters of the ship, your leaders will work with the experienced captain to choose the best itinerary and route to maximize the photographic opportunities along the way, responding to local conditions of weather and ice as necessary. Our small but capable expedition vessel will sleep ten guests (in addition to your three leaders and the ship's crew) in five cabins each with two bunks. Two Superior Cabins have en suite private bathrooms, and the other three Standard Cabins share two surprisingly spacious bathrooms with showers and plenty of hot water.



SINGLE OCCUPANCY

Due to our exclusive charter of the Hans Hansson and the fact that our group's flight reservations have to be contracted for in advance by the ship's operator based on the maximum possible number of guests (that is, on the flights we have to pay for two seats per ship's cabin, regardless of whether the cabin is ultimately occupied by one or two guests), the rates for single-occupancy bookings have to be nearly double the rate for double-occupancy cabins.

INDIVIDUAL TRAVELERS BOOKING DOUBLE OCCUPANCY

Individuals traveling alone are welcome to book at the double occupancy rate and we will match you with a cabin mate on *Hans Hansson*. We will attempt to match cabin mates of the same sex, but due to the small group size this cannot be guaranteed. Hotel rooms in Punta Arenas will be single occupancy for individuals booking double occupancy. There is a \$500 supplement for this registration option, which will be added to the final payment. If you have pre-arranged to share a room with another participant, you may book at the normal double occupancy rate.

EXPECTATIONS

TRAVELING TO ANTARCTICA

The photographic opportunities and the experience of exploring the Antarctic in a vessel are unparalleled, but it is important to be aware of the conditions of this expedition and ensure that it is suitable for you. We will be traveling to remote destinations far from medical facilities, and there will be little to no communications with family, friends, and the outside world while on board Hans Hansson. Although participating in this expedition does not require a particularly high level of physical fitness, you should be able to:

- Be without medical assistance for up to 30 days
- Swim or float on your back
- Get in and out of a Zodiac boat on a beach with a little wave action.
- Walk a mile on uneven and slightly hilly terrain at a steady pace without getting exhausted
- Climb a 6 ft (2m) step ladder

You will be required to submit a medical history form to the vessel's operator, Quixote Expeditions, as well as a **confirmation from your physician** that you are fit enough to participate in this expedition. If you have any questions or concerns about the nature of this expedition or any health or fitness concerns that may present a challenge to participating on it, please contact us.

INSURANCE

It is important to be aware that weather conditions – most commonly poor visibility due to fog – do from time to time delay the Antarctica Airways flights between Punta Arenas and King George Island and back. The goal of the airline is to identify the best weather window each day, and operate all the day's flights during that period,

so it is best to think of our flight being scheduled for a particular day rather than a particular time. So long as we fly on the scheduled days, we consider that a success. Delays are usually brief (minutes, a few hours, or perhaps one day), and sometimes the flight schedule is moved up a day earlier to get ahead of incoming bad weather, which is one of the reasons that we spend two nights in Punta Arenas at the start of the trip. That said, a few years ago a large group operated by another company aboard a cruise ship was delayed in Punta Arenas for several days due to uncommonly bad weather, resulting in outright cancellation of the trip. It is also possible that the flight will be delayed returning to Punta Arenas, which may necessitate additional hotel nights and rebooking flights. Therefore, we **strongly recommend obtaining travel insurance that provides full coverage for the cost of your trip in the event of trip cancellation**, as well as travel interruption or delays that may impact your arrival or departure from this expedition. Visionary Wild is not responsible for additional costs incurred due to weather or travel delays.

Emergency medical treatment and evacuation coverage (minimum US\$300,000) are required for this expedition.

BOOKING TRAVEL

All guests should plan to arrive in Punta Arenas on January 27. This will also allow some additional time in case of flight or baggage delays. The flight is scheduled for January 29, but as mentioned above the timing is weather dependent and is not decided until the day of travel. It is even possible that the group may need to fly to King George Island on the evening of January 28th if there is incoming bad weather forecast for January 29th. Once our flight departs Punta Arenas for King George Island, it will not be possible for anyone arriving late to catch up with and join the group.







We will be traveling to remote destinations far from medical facilities, and there will be little to no communications with family, friends, and the outside world while on board Hans Hansson. Although participating in this expedition does not require a particularly high level of physical fitness, you should be able to:

INSURANCE

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Emergency medical treatment and evacuation coverage (minimum US\$300,000) are required for this expedition.

BOOKING TRAVEL

All guests should plan to arrive in Punta Arenas on January 14. This will also allow some additional time in case of flight or baggage delays. The flight is scheduled for January 16, but as mentioned above the timing is weather dependent and is not decided until the day of travel. It is even possible that the group may need to fly to King George Island on the evening of January 15th if there is incoming bad weather forecast for January 16th. Once our flight departs Punta Arenas for King George Island, it will not be possible for anyone arriving late to catch up with and join the group.

We recommend that you use a travel agent to book your flights to Punta Arenas, Chile, as it would be possible to email your travel agent from the vessel, who would then be able to work on rebooking your international flights on your behalf in the event of a delay of the return flight from King George Island to Punta Arenas.

Travel Report: Antarctica with Visionary Wild January 2023

A dream journey is behind us. After two years of corona pandemic, it could finally start. The photographic travel company Visionary Wild from the USA under the direction of Lena and Justin Black had offered the trip for ambitious and enthusiastic photographers. With the help of a German travel agency, we were able to book a cabin two years ago. Antarctica is not a classic tourist resort. It requires high demands of the organization of the trip and preparation of travelers, and this was done perfectly by Visionary Wild. Not only in terms of equipment and clothing, but also important tips for photo equipment were given. At a Zoom meeting, the participants were able to get to know each other and ask questions about the trip. Everyone was picked up from the airport in Punta Arenas. We were the only Germans, the others came from all parts of the USA. Our tour guides were Justin Black, an excellent photographer, Chris Eckström a very well-known writer and videographer, and Frans Lanting, one of the best landscape and wildlife photographers of our time.



The journey started from Punta Arenas in the south of Chile. In the hotel in Punta Arenas the last instructions were provided before we flew by plane to King George Island, thus avoiding the dreaded rough seas of the Drake passage. Two Zodiacs took us out to our private ship, the Hans Hansson – ice class, 27-meters long, and 11 knots fast. She has 6 cabins for guests on 2 decks.





The crew consisted of 7 people, the captain, 3 helmsmen, 1 engineer, 1 stewardess, and the chef in the galley. Due to the size of the ship, we were able to anchor overnight in the shelter of small bays. Two to four times each day, we were brought ashore with the two Zodiacs to make extended photo excursions led by Frans, Chris, and Justin.









The scenery and wildlife were overwhelming. Trips to the icebergs were also undertaken. The crew was very helpful and always concerned about our safety.

So we were able to experience Antarctica up close.



The daily program was discussed in detail every day with a briefing and tips for the photo equipment were given.





Periodically, we had the opportunity to download and review the pictures. Several times, a selection of pictures by each participant were discussed and constructively critiqued by Justin Black and Frans Lanting, with very good tips. Justin Black also gave very interesting lectures on recording and image processing techniques. So we also received very good training. During the day there was breakfast, usually at 7 o'clock to make the most of the day, at noon and in the evening a warm meal, which was very tastily prepared by the English cook with love
